- Dominant Generation Fuel nearly 60% of MWh are generated from natural gas. Recent non-gas plant retirement announcements. More are likely coming.
- Gas Transportation Challenges shale production brings gas closer to New England, but it still has to get there. New pipelines are being proposed to increase transportation capability.
- Who Pays generators can't rationalize 20-year firm transportation contracts. States exploring alternatives.

ISO New England "Performance Incentive" Forward Capacity Market

- •3-year forward, 1-year commitment auction
- •During shortage events:
 - Units that outperform their capacity
 obligations receive a performance payment
 - Units that underperform pay a penalty
- Designed to drive generator performance



What Did Gas Generators Sign Up For?

- •Nov. 5, 2012, ISO-NE Memo required "firm fuel"
- •May 17, 2013, NEPGA Complaint at FERC physical lack of fuel is not a tariff violation
- •Aug. 27, 2013, FERC Order found no tariff violation for physical fuel unavailability for units dispatched in real-time or beyond day-ahead commitment

- Low Wholesale Prices combination of low natural gas prices and intense competition have led to lowest wholesale electricity prices in a decade
- Momentum to End Rate-Base Generation PSNH under pressure from customer migration and low wholesale prices to complete restructuring.
- Emissions Down, Renewables Up CO2 down 18%, NOX down 66% and SO2 down 71% – Tremendous regional investments in wind, solar and biomass.

Competitive prices with innovation occurring. Focus now on a commercially-sustainable marketplace.
